What is 4-H?

4-H is an informal educational opportunity where youth learn by doing in project areas like science, health, agriculture & citizenship. Our club offers a variety of activities for youth, ages 5-19. Youth join a club, take part in monthly meetings run by members, and explore their individual interests through projects.

Our club is run by adult volunteers and project meetings are set and run by additional adult volunteers. Members can also participate in a number of county, sectional (multi-county), and state-wide 4-H events. Annual program fee is \$69 per youth member.
